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Reminder: vowels and consonants?

- articulatory characteristics
- Vowel: the airstream flows out (relatively) freely, without a major obstacle in the vocal tract. It is usually accompanied by voicing.
- -> No contact between articulators.
- -> Hard to define the place of articulation.

Cardinal Vowels

- Daniel Jones (1881-1967): born in London, learned phonetics from Paul Passy, of phonetics at Sorbonne.
- References to describe all the possible vowels in the world's languages.
- Primary and secondary cardinal vowels.
